

# Schedule of Review

## **Aims of the review of Castlerigg Manor**

To provide an objective opinion on the effectiveness of the work undertaken at Castlerigg Manor and to record observations, make suggestions and recommendations for the future.

This review will be guided by the four aims for the youth service outlined in the document 'Fit for Mission'
